THE ONE & ONLY Gospel

Galatians:1: ⁵to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen. ⁶I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting **him who called you** in the grace of Christ and are turning to a **different gospel**— ⁷not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to **distort the gospel of Christ**.

John 12: ⁴But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (he who was about to betray him), said, ⁵"Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" ⁶He said this, not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief, and having charge of the moneybag he used to help himself to what was put into it. ⁷Jesus said, "Leave her alone, so that she may keep it for the day of my burial. ⁸For the poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me."

John 4: ³⁴Jesus said to them, "**My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work.** ³⁵Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, **lift up your eyes**, and **SEE** that the fields are white for harvest. ³⁶Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life (*age-lasting life*), so that sower and reaper may rejoice together.

Mark 1: ¹The beginning of the **gospel of Jesus Christ**, the Son of God.

⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan.

¹⁰And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove.

¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.

¹² The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. ¹³ And he was in the wilderness forty days, being tempted by Satan. And he was with the wild animals, and the angels were ministering to him. ¹⁴ Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, **proclaiming the gospel of God**, ¹⁵and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and **the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel.**"

John 4: Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest.

Philippians 4: ³Yes, I ask you also, true companion, help these women, who have **labored side by side with me in the gospel** together with Clement and the rest of **my fellow workers**, whose names are in the book of life.

1 Corinthians 3: ⁹For we are **God's fellow workers**. You are God's field, God's building.

Colossians 4: ⁷Tychicus will tell you all about my activities. He is a beloved brother and **faithful minister and fellow servant in the Lord**. ⁸I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are and that **he may encourage your hearts**, ⁹and with him Onesimus, our faithful and beloved brother, who is one of you. They will tell you of everything that has taken place here. ¹⁰ Aristarchus my fellow prisoner greets you, and Mark the cousin of Barnabas (concerning whom you have received instructions— if he comes to you, welcome him), ¹¹and Jesus who is called Justus. These are **the only men** of the circumcision **among my fellow workers for the kingdom of God**, and they have been a comfort to me.

Galatians 1: ⁴who gave himself for our sins to deliver us from the present evil age, **according to the will of our God and Father**,

2 Corinthians 4: ¹⁷For this **light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory BEYOND ALL COMPARISON**

¹⁸ **AS** we look **not** to the things that are seen **BUT** to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal. (*Age-lasting*)

2 Corinthians 1: ⁸For we do not want you to be ignorant, brothers, of the affliction we experienced in Asia. **For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength that we despaired of life itself.** ⁹**Indeed, we felt that we had received the sentence of death.** But that was to make us rely not on ourselves but on God who raises the dead. ¹⁰ He delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us. On him we have **set our hope** that he will deliver us again. ¹¹ You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many.

2 Corinthians 11: ¹⁶I repeat, let no one think me foolish. But even if you do, accept me as a fool, so that I too may boast a little. ¹⁷What I am saying with this boastful confidence, I say not with the Lord's authority but as a fool. ¹⁸**Since many boast according to the flesh, I too will boast.**

¹⁹For you gladly bear with fools, being wise yourselves!

²⁰For you bear it if someone makes slaves of you, or devours you, or takes advantage of you, or puts on airs, or strikes you in the face. ²¹To my shame, I must say, we were too weak for that! But whatever anyone else dares to boast of—I am speaking as a fool—I also dare to boast of that. ²²**Are they Hebrews?** So am I. **Are they Israelites?** So am I. **Are they offspring of Abraham?** So am I.

²³Are they servants of Christ? I am a better one—I am talking like a madman—with far greater labors, far more imprisonments, with countless beatings, and often near death. ²⁴Five times **I received at the hands of the Jews** the forty lashes less one. ²⁵Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; ²⁶on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from **my own people**, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, **danger from false brothers**;

¹³For such men are false apostles, deceitful workmen, **disguising themselves as apostles of Christ.** ¹⁴And no wonder, for even **Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.** ¹⁵So it is **no surprise** if his servants, also, **disguise themselves as servants of righteousness.** Their end will correspond to their deeds.

²⁷ in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.

²⁸And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches. ²⁹ Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to fall, and I am not indignant? ³⁰ If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness. ³¹ The God and Father of the Lord Jesus, he who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. ³²At Damascus, the governor under King Aretas was guarding the city of Damascus in order to seize me, ³³ but I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall and escaped his hands.

1 Corinthians 15: ⁵⁷But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁵⁸ Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain

1 Corinthians 9: ²⁵Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. ²⁶**So I do not run aimlessly;** I do not box as one beating the air. ²⁷But I discipline my body and keep it under control, **lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.**
