Sight and Sounds of the Greek Letters (Module A)

Study Aid Level Two: See and Say the Greek Alphabet

By this time, you should know most of the Greek letters and their alphabetical order. The pronunciation of each Greek alphabetical letter is learned by proper pronunciation of its alphabetical name. Click on any letter and hear the alphabetical name pronounced twice by the instructor. Notice that each new line begins with a vowel that corresponds to the English vowels "a", "e", "i", "o", and "u".

Color code for the above letters:

1. All vowels are in this **color**: Αα, Εε, Ηη, Ιι, Οο, Υυ, Ωω.
2. All labial consonants are in this **color**: Ββ, Ππ, Φφ.
3. All nasal labial continuant consonants are in this **color**: Μμ, Νν.
4. All palatal consonants are in this **color**: Γγ, Κκ, Χχ.
5. All dental consonants are in this **color**: Δδ, Θθ, Ττ.
6. All compound-continuant consonants are in this **color**: Ζζ, Ξξ, Ψψ.
7. All liquid-continuant consonants are in this **color**: Λλ, Ρρ.
8. The single sibilant continuant consonant is in this **color**: Σσ.

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
